BIG IDEAS

Curious about compost? Today, you will EXPLORE the 4 ingredients that make up a healthy compost recipe and EXPLAIN why it is important to compost.



YOU WILL NEED:

- Pencil and/or colored pencils

- *Optional* – a pile of compost
- *Optional* – Taste-Test: avocado toast – (browns) piece of toast or crackers, (green) avocado smash to “taste-test”

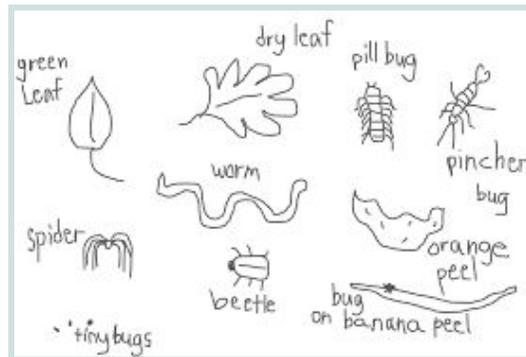
WHAT TO DO:

1. **REVIEW** the [Green Heart Rules of Respect](#). *New to Green Heart lessons? Check out our [Respect the Garden](#) lesson.*
2. **WATCH:** [Charleston County Compost](#). In your journal, **ANSWER:** the following questions.
 - 1) What is compost?
 - 2) Why is it important?
 - 3) How does composting a way to respect the Earth?
3. **READ:** the [compost recipe](#) to learn about the four ingredients that make up a healthy compost pile. Use the recipe to help you complete the activities below.
4. **CHOOSE:** an option and complete the activity.

Option #1: *access to compost* – **EXPLORE:** a pile of compost. **LOCATE:** all four ingredients. What else can you find in the compost?

Option #2: *access to outside space* – **COLLECT:** all four ingredients and make your own compost pile. If you choose to make your own compost, learn more by watching the [Compost at Home Video](#).

Option #3: *without access to outdoor space* – **ILLUSTRATE:** 1-2 examples of all four ingredients in your journal.



5. **TASTE-TEST (OPTIONAL)** - Your taste test, avocado toast, represents some of the ingredients in compost. The browns (cracker/toast), greens (avocado). Try your avocado toast in 3...2...1... Taste test!

 - b. Give your taste-test a Green Heart rating.
 3= the best thing you've ever tasted!, 2= it was okay, but not my favorite, 1= I don't really care for it
